## HIGH SCHOOL INSTRUCTORS IN THE CIS PROGRAM

CIS Instructors attend an orientation workshop at the beginning of the year to...

Become familiar with the syllabus requirements. Learn about the college-wide and classroom assessment expectations

Learn about the policies and procedures for the college systems.

CIS Instructors are required to maintain approved course syllabi at the beginning of each semester or year that is in alignment with the equivalent CLC course syllabus. During the course, the CIS Instructor


reviews students handbooks with students, reviews class lists for proper registration, submits student grades, communicates with the CIS Collaborator and attends other professional development activities.

## COLLEGE COLLABORATORS IN THE CIS PROGRAM

CLC faculty serve as CIS Collaborators to provide on-going support to the high school instructors. The role of the CIS Collaborator is to assist with CIS Instructor credential reviews and professional development plans and opportunities. make classroom observations, provide teaching resources, and communicating in multiple ways, ensure that the CIS course demonstrates the same content, learning, environment, assessment, and pedagogy as CLC college courses, maintain contact with CIS Instructors throughout the year, by phone, e-mail, or personal visits, as needed, to support their teaching of Central Lake College's CIS course, and visit CIS Instructors in their classrooms a minimum of once during the term for a repeated course and a minimum of twice if it is a new CIS course and/or instructor.



At OE Global 2019, I was inspired to use the UNSDG's to redesign the Introduction to Global Studies course. We put out a call for high school collaborators to offer this course as a part of their CIS program. Joy Davis, Spanish Instructor at Melrose Public Schools and Lori-Beth Larsen met to redesign the OER for Introduction to Global Studies. We focused on creating an instructor's set of resources using the UNSDG's as content, and offering renewable assignment options for each unit.

The course is being taught at Melrose H.S. by Joy Davis and will be taught again at CLC and in 4 other area high schools in the CIS partnership.



At the end of Spring semester 2021, we'll be taking a look at both the Critical Literacy and Global Studies courses to understand what changes might need to be made to the OER. We hope to expand offerings of these CIS courses.
